Safety Committee Report John 'J.J.' Carbino Safety Committee Chairperson



The spring meet has just finished. I am happy to report that there were no injuries to report. I am pleased with the new operation and safety guidelines revisions that were just handed out at the meet. There are a few items that will need to be looked at for further clarification in the new book, but over all it looks good.

I understand that new tests are in the work for those who wish to take the engineer (non-steam and steam), conductor/trainperson, and station master tests. Clio and Vern Geyer, I believe, are putting together new test sheets and will present the updated versions to the Board for approval.

A new spread sheet has been established with all the members' names. It will contain the positions and members status in being an engineer, conductor/trainperson, and station master that deal with the public.

For the clarification or changes in the operation and safety rules, the Board and safety committee will work together to present a more clarified wording. I.e.: rule #304 engineers.

I wish to thank Karle Mahler & Company for their time to rewrite the old safety and rules guidelines and looking into a better

explanation of these rules I.e.: rule # 304.

I have toured most of the museums facility and find it in fairly good condition and when I noticed unsafe areas, I have brought them to the attention of the board. I hope to start looking at all the facilities buildings and cars for unsafe conditions through out the year.

I introduced my self on Saturday at the spring meet and went over some of the safety rules. At the 15-20 minute talk the Board President re-assured all that I am going to ensure that the guidelines are to be adhered too. We have become complacent in following them over the past few years, and I will be looking at these areas that the museum can correct to prevent accidents now and in the future. I have all-ready made a couple of recommendations to members that work in special areas and corrections are in the works. There will be more recommendations coming.

I plan to have a short safety committee meeting at the park on run days I attend. I will notify the safety committee prior to the run days.

Finally, I want to thank the trainmaster for taking on the monumental task of seeing all who brought equipment arrived and operated safely. The station masters again were on top of their game on instructing the public who rode the trains. Last the track superintendent for repairs on the track and utilizing a flag person to direct train traffic through the work area.



SAFETY RULES FOR THE MONTH

108. The use of gondola cars will not be permitted for riding the general public.

222. Color signals, lights or flags:

Single head signal:

A. Red STOP.

B. Yellow APPROACH - Proceed with caution,

prepare to stop at next signal.

C. Flashing Yellow APPROACH MEDIUM -

Proceed to next signal at reduced speed.

D. Green

Proceed

Double head signal

- E. Red over Yellow DIVERGING APPROACH MEDIUM proceed on diverging route with reduce speed.
- F. Yellow over Yellow APPROACH DIVERGING Proceed prepared to take diverging route at next signal.

Flag:

- H. Blue Equipment must not be coupled or moved.

 Workman be in or under the equipment. A blue signal shall never be removed by anyone except the person who put it there.
- 311. The Stationmaster and all members of every train crew of any train hauling passengers shall ascertain that all passengers are told and understand the passenger safety rules before the train leaves the station, as set forth here:
- A. Remain seated facing forward at all time while the train is in motion.
- B. Remain seated on the train until it returns to the station.
- C. Do not lean out nor reach for anything along the rightof-way while the train is in motion.
- D. Keep hand and feet inside the car at all times while the train is in motion.
- E. Do not yell or scream while riding on the train, except in an emergency.
- F. Anyone disobeying these rules may be asked to leave the facility.
- 413. All locomotives or engineers' riding cars shall have braking devices that can be activated easily and quickly by the engineer. Such breaking devices shall have the power to slow and stop the entire train within a reasonable distance, depending on the weight and speed of the train.


