

YARD MASTERS REPORT

We have been blessed to have AmeriCorps with us again for the end of March. They have been very busy digging, mulching, and cleaning the yard of debris.

We are putting lights in the first sea container and tractor container. We will also have commercial grade lighting for the steamer bays (Thanks to Brad Jones). This will provide better security and will be good for loading trains at night. This should be completed for the spring meet.

The facility is in great shape thanks to the mulching of trees and planting areas with the donation from Arborwell. Also, the track has been completely sprayed. One more upgrade to the picnic area includes a new deck outside the caboose thanks to Larry and his crew from Coloma Church of Christ. Thanks for the donation of time and material.

I believe the park is in the best shape I have seen it. Come and see us for the Spring Meet May 1 and 2.







In my last report I thought that the 1973 would be ready by the beginning of March. Well it is the end of March, and as you can see from the pictures of the engine it is currently in a state of discombobulation. However! It is now painted discombobulation, there is a difference. Brad Jones did nearly all of the "heavy lifting" by prepping, masking, lettering and painting the tender and the engine's jacket, domes, running boards, and especially the cab which came out great.

Christine is in the middle of cleaning, prepping and painting the engine's frame, no mean feat considering the years of accumulated grim and grunge. She painted the smoke box and outer fire box side sheets a dark metallic gray to simulate a coating of graphite and linseed oil. Chris also made the brackets which support the piping under the running boards and is our resident calligrapher making the number stencils for the bug boards (train indicators).

The boiler is shown to give an idea of what has been done before the insulation and jacket are installed. The stand offs provide the spacing for jacket and boiler while bands will hold them in position. Ross and I did a low pressure hydro to start the process of finding and correcting any leaks. We filled the boiler with water and pressurized it to 65 pounds. The boiler needs to be as tight as possible before the insulation is installed to reduce the chance of getting it wet and trapping water between boiler and jacket.

I've been keeping busy by painting pipes and continuing to build parts that the engine needs. When will it be finished, now that all parts are back from paint, 1973 should be back on its home rails at the end of April.

Thanks to Jack Rockett, Frank Smith and Dick Esselbach for their help installing the siding at Hillview.


20 Years ago: EDITOR request: I need newsletter copies for the months of: 3,9,10,11,12 of 1990. If you have these please call Bill.

Safety Rules for the Month


117. No pets of any kind shall be FIRSTÖ allowed to run free within the facility. All pets shall be confined on a leash not

over six (6) feet in length, or inside the owners car, (as per park rules). The owner of such pets shall be responsible for immediately cleaning up any manure or other disagreeable mess caused by such pet. Any violation of this rule may result in both pet and owner being asked to leave the facility. Animals may not ride on public passenger trains.

Engine whistle signals shall be used by the engineer whenever practical to give, ask for, or acknowledge information about train movement. When double heading, the lead engine will give the whistle signals when possible. The whistle shall not be used unnecessarily. The whistle is a signaling device and should be used as such.

309. All operating personnel, while on duty, shall have a copy of these operating rules in their possession. (See rule #118).

Dummy or solid type couplers shall be constructed so they operate with the standard working knuckle coupler. Coupler height shall conform to I.B.L.S. standards.

1: 1.5" scale, 7.5" gauge Clishay locomotive and riding car. \$6,500. Engine is a two cylinder double acting 1 1/4x1 1/2". Boiler upgraded from the original 8" diameter water tube to a steel 10" diameter propane fired fire tube boiler with 73 1/2" copper fire tubes. Pneumatic FWD/REV shift and brakes on locomotive. Usual Accessories: working headlight, bell, new whistle, two new relief valves, engine driven feed pump and a hand pump. New body and trucks on riding car. Engine and tender set-up on a single axle trailer for transport.

2: Recently refurbished CRAB locomotive and tender. Loco is about 14" wide and 22" long. Two cylinder double acting engine with a bore and stroke of 1.375 x 2.5".
