Well! The1973 was back on its home rails on Sunday, April 18, for a brief and somewhat shining moment. Actually! When I remind myself that the purpose of the trip was to fire the engine for the first time the endeavor was a success. It was definitely a learning experience.

I now have new values for setting the burner gas pressure during the initial fire up and just how long it takes to build the steam pressure to the operating range. Of course, this being the first fire up, I had a twinge of self doubt wondering if any mistakes had been made. As it turned out, everything went pretty much as expected, there are some leaks in the water glass plumbing and a few other spots that should be easy to correct. I discovered rather late in the plumbing rebuild that one of my happy places, Ace Hardware, sells a TFE (Teflon) pipe thread paste that will seal the most recalcitrant pipe joints. I heartily recommend keeping some in your engine tool box.

Other problems included the injector not

picking up. That will require tearing down the injector and sacrificing a chicken to the gods of improbable mechanical oddities. Somewhat more serious was the #1 safety not reseating after it popped. The boiler pressure could not be maintained without over firing. I did run the engine out of the steaming bay and up the hill a short distance without any other problems. The engine is scheduled to return to the back shop Tuesday and the shop forces will make the repairs as quickly as possible and return it to service.



And for those who are steam qualified you should review the steam rules as the Clubs steam engine should be back in service.


As your new safety chairman I just want everybody to be safe when you are at the track and have a good fun filled day and be happy when you go home.

Safety Rules for the Month:

110A. A maximum of 5 persons will be allowed on Each straddle car including the engineer and conductor. If all persons are adults only, 3 persons per car is the maximum allowed.

111. Passengers shall not take food, drinks, or other refreshments other than water aboard any train,

Nor may any person, passenger, or crew member smoke while on board.

- F. ---- Flagman return to train.


G. -OOO Flagman protect rear of train.

H. --O- Approaching public crossing, area of restricted visibility or a train on adjacent track.

I. OOOOOOOO (8) Warning to people or animals on track; general alarm.

310. The Board of Directors may restrict or suspend from duty any operating personnel who consistently violates safety rules.

404. Couplers or drawbars between engine and engineers riding car, or between any combination of engine, riding car and fuel car shall be of a drawbar with lock pin type or equivalent that cannot become accidentally uncoupled nor disconnect any fuel lines in case of derailment.
