
By Darrell Gomes February was the month that started the removal of all the track at Midway, Cordova Junction, and sections of main



YARD MASTERS REPORT



Americorps has finished their three week project with us. During that time they got most of the track replaced in Midway and from Tin Man to Reverso switch.

They also expanded the water main from Thorley's berm to the other side of Tin Man Bridge and from Placerville to the north fence line. They also helped clean up the yard and lay cobble down in South Cobble Creek. All their work is much appreciated and has helped us come a long way with the track replacement. Now we need your help to finish the project. The track needs to be ballasted and level. And there are three to four switches that need to be rebuilt. Contact Darrell to help out in any way you can.

I am getting the area by the flag pole ready for the new memorial that is ready to go. The plan is build a raised bed for the memorial to sit on, surrounded by a decomposed granite patio and outlined with a mulched flower bed. My plan since becoming yardmaster was to eliminate most of the push mowing around the track. Once this area is complete the only area left to mow by hand is the loading bays, Hall's cut, and near oasis siding. Thank you to Americorps and all that helped out for the month of February.



Safety Rules Review

116. Anyone consuming any alcoholic beverages, including beer, or use of anyillegal drugs or narcotics of any kind shall be requested to cease. If they refuse, they will be the facility

asked to leave the facility.

231. Any member wishing to use any SVLSRM owned rail equipment at the facility must make this request to the Trainmaster (Article IV Section 11.) The member must report to the Trainmaster any damage or operational problems that occurred while in their care at the time of the equipment return. The member must return the equipment to the location from where it was issued.

308. For insurance purposes: engineers and conductor on trains hauling the general public MUST be qualified members of SVLSRM, and pass a qualification test.

414. All locomotives shall be equipped with a whistle, horn, or sounding device for sounding locomotive signals. Such sounding device shall be powerful enough to be heard distinctly for at least 150 feet.
