

During our track replacement project this winter we have been adding to the water main. The north water main loop is complete and half the south loop is completed. We can tap off the north loop now to put in ground water irrigation to eliminate hauling hoses around to water.

I will also be working on the new memorial area by the flag pole. Should be done in early May. I hope to spend enough time out there to finish for the spring meet. Anyone interested in spreading mulch or helping with memorial area let me know. (The memorial will be raised with a brick wall around it.) Also, Darrell is reconfiguring the midway siding. 20 Years ago:



Safety Rules Review

118. Visiting engineers, trainman, and their guests are to observe these rules and abide by them. Copies of these rules shall be made available to visiting engineers while they are operating on SVLSRM tracks. Visitors may

purchase copies of these rules to keep.

202. All engines must be run at a safe speed and under complete control at all times. (Refer to Rule 229 for a definition of safe speed.)

310. The Board of Directors may restrict or suspend from duty any operating personnel who consistently violates safety rules.

416. All trains running during periods of low visibility or after sunset shall be equipped with a marker light, or lights on the rear of the last car showing a red light to the rear and visible for at least 150 feet.
