

Vice President nominee



Train Masters Report

The Fall meet was great and well attended. We had to have a few people double up on steaming bays. On Sunday most of the teenage boys wanted to run the club steamer, which I let them. Most needed someone to watch over

them, a few ran it no problem. We had a total of 7 who had never run the steam engine before. If any one wishes to learn how to run the steam engine, and we have it out, all you have to do is ask.

On the RS-3 and the UP I have added a float charging system to them. You will notice a flashing blue sign on them. To disconnect them for use: First unplug the unit from the wall outlet. Then unplug the engine from the charging cable. Make sure to put the protective plug/cap on the locomotive side plug. When done with the engine, hook it back up in the reverse order. There are instructions on the wall above the outlets as a reminder.



Freelance 7.5" Gauge 0-4-0, 7.5" Gauge, 1.5" Scale, Oil Fired, 2" Winton Cylinders

This locomotive was built by Mr. Terry Taylor in 1972. It features an axel pump and a hand pump. There is also the necessary plumbing for an injector. The locomotive is fired up on a regular basis at the Golden Gate Live Steamers. It holds 3 gallons of fuel oil and about 10 gallons of water if I recall correctly. It was weighed in at just about 350 lbs. It has hauled the club public train with a total of 22 passengers on board.

The locomotive is very complete with detail. I have had this locomotive for 2 ½ years and it has been an interesting journey through the ups and downs of locomotive ownership. It's all part of the fun. I am selling my locomotive because I'm ready for a bit of change and I would like someone else to enjoy my locomotive as much as I did!

Safety Rules Review

109. Cargo weight should be evenly distributed between the trucks of each car.

- No person shall consume or use any alcoholic beverages, including beer, or any narcotics or illegal drugs while acting in the capacity of conductor or operating any equipment within the SVLSRM facility. Violations of rules 223 or 224 may be cause for immediate suspension of all rights of membership pending a hearing of the case.
- 302. All members share equal privileges and use of the facilities. All members also have equal responsibility for the safety and maintenance of the facility, equipment, and the observance and enforcement of these rules. Every member is responsible to, and for, every other member. There are no socalled "privileged" members.
- 415. All locomotives operating during periods of low visibility or after sunset shall be equipped with a working headlight that may be seen clearly for a distance of at least 150 feet and sufficient lighting in the locomotive cab to read the gauges and see the controls clearly.
