



was for me. To my knowledge, there were no major derailments out on the main line. Thank you to Darrell Gomes, Bill Noyer, and the rest of the track crew that found time before the Meet to work on all sorts of projects to make the weekend better, including the re-ballasting needed from the Water Geyser of 2016.

If you hadn't notice, the Boxcar yard is now sporting a new feature...Collapsible Bumpers! The 6 bright, yellow bumpers were designed by Ross Crawford, manufactured by Carl Mahler

and Steve Milward, and installed by the aforementioned Steve. Say goodbye to runaway riding cars and the use of ties to




stop those riding cars. These Collapsible Bumpers will be on everyone's Christmas wish list come December!

Upcoming projects for June and July will be cutting in the new, steel switches at the SP caboose and continuing to finish the track at Reverse-O.

A lock box has been placed near the swing gates at the mower shed that contains a key to the padlock for the yellow gate giving access to our area. It is important to put the key back after opening the gate and to insure the gate is also closed

and locked once you have passed through. This is needed to stop illegal dumping to the parks containers.

May Board Summary by Chris Donhost, Secretary

- Heidi announced that Kerry Wilson has agreed to be Membership Chair.
- We have a new insurance broker- Kaliff Insurance of Texas. The restrictions from our former broker/ carrier are now gone. We can use any locomotive to run public trains.
- Peter Welch reported the 0-4-0 does run. The RS3 will be working by the meet.
- Andy stated that phase 1 of caboose remodel is done. Phase 2 will be installing bookcases for the library.
- The Park is having issues with illegal dumping so has been locking the yellow gate. Dennis working on a solution for members to have access via a lock box with gate key.
- A change will be made in the party rental agreement to make a portion of the deposit non-refundable to prevent a loss to the club from bank credit card transaction fees.
- A propane tank will be purchased for the 0-4-0 fuel car; Andy & Peter will build the car.


