Ken described in the grant how he became acquainted with SVLS. "My family moved to Rancho Cordova in 1967 where I served the last 4 years of my 29 year career in the United States Air Force. Shortly after retirement from Mather in 1971, I learned about the young club that was just starting to take shape. My affiliation with SVLS has been a family affair. It is something my wife Nadine and I have shared with our children. One of my favorite pastimes has been giving school children rides on my train. Class field trips have always been a unique time to teach children about our railroad heritage, while sharing the awe and wonder of riding the rails. SVLS has provided me an opportunity to enjoy my passion for railroading, and simultaneously serve my local community."

On April 18 our club received notification that Rancho Cordova Rotary has awarded Lt. Col. Ken Willes (RET) the "Hometown Hero" grant of \$3500 for our tractor garage.

Congratulations and our thanks to the Rancho Cordova Rotary Club and the efforts of Ken and Chris.

Ken was active during three wars: WWII, Korean, and Vietnam. He proudly displays his Distinguished Flying Cross, which is for heroism or extraordinary achievement while participating in an aerial flight. Ken was a Navigator on B24 aircraft during WWII and was awarded the Flying Cross for the longest flight under combat fire during the first daylight raid over Bangkok, Thailand. That mission was his 50th.

SAFETY RULES FOR THE MONTH 1.02.07 Gondola Cars



The use of gondola cars will not be permitted for carrying the general public.

3.04 Safety Chains

All trains running are required to have steel safety chains or cable (1/8" minimum thickness) connecting the locomotive and any car behind the engine, whether occupied or not. Draw bars are acceptable in place of chains or cables.

4.01.02 Qualifications/Restrictions of a "Private" Engineer

- 18 years of age or older.
- Member of SVLSRM or a visiting club member in good standing.
- Passenger restrictions: Only SVLSRM members and guests (and must include a Flagman).

5.01.02 Length of Train

Trains carrying the general public shall not exceed one hundred (100) feet in length over all, exclusive of locomotive and tender or other motive power.
