It has been partially emptied but will require some very careful work to finish emptying the rest. This container will eventually hold the tractor, the trencher, and other tools. The OLD container #3, by the boxcar, will get two tracks installed to hold the work train and eventually a string of riding cars. This is according to the original plan from years ago. There is being considered a plan to extend the two new tracks possibly as far south as near Oasis where they will merge into the oasis siding, providing additional siding capacity.



A list of names for parking passes and admittance to Roseville International Rail Fair has been submitted. It was disappointing for me to have to phone so many people to find helpers when

the Sign-up Genie was ignored by most of you. A little help would have been great!!! I will get detailed info out to you via e-mail as the date gets closer. After the portable track is tied down to the track trailer, I will take it home with me and also bring it out Friday morning. This structure will bolted together for future use without needing to be rebuilt each time and should be more sturdy and secure.

From last month, it was reported that the SVLSRM board acted on a 1-day only sale that Titan Trains was having, essentially saving \$4,000 off their "Dash-9" locomotive. The board then reviewed possible additions at the October board meeting, but ultimately decided to take the locomotive "as-is". The board's proposal was then brought to the General Membership for a vote on October 20th where the membership approved the purchase price plus an additional \$1000 for paint and other modifications. 

At last 3 green containers all lined up in a row.






The new container was acquired thanks to the Rancho Cordova Rotary's "Hometown Hero Grant" which was awarded to SVLSRM.

SAFETY RULES FOR THE MONTH

1.04 Pets

No pets of any kind shall be allowed to run free within the facility. All pets shall be confined on a leash not over six (6) feet in length, or inside a crate or pen. The owner of such pets shall be responsible

for immediately cleaning up any manure or other disagreeable mess caused by such pet. Any violation of this rule may result in both pet and owner being asked to leave the facility. Animals may not ride on public passenger trains.

3.16 Fluids Discharge

Any overflow or discharge of steam, water or oil from the engine or other equipment shall be directed away from people, and in such a manner that it is not deposited on the rails or seating.

4.13 Stopping

Except in an emergency or controlled signal, no train shall stop on any bridge, crossing, switch, or mainline track, except in a station where such mainline track is part of the station. Any train that is stopped or fouling on the mainline must call out a flagman to protect to the rear with a red flag or light that may be clearly seen by a following engineer for a distance of at least one hundred fifty (150) feet.

5.02 Conduct of Passengers

The Stationmaster and all members of every train crew of any train hauling the General Public shall ascertain that all passengers are informed of passenger safety rules before the train leaves the station, as set forth here (See further Section 1.02):

Passengers shall remain on the train during unscheduled stops unless otherwise directed. Engineers and Conductor are responsible for orderly passenger conduct.

The train crew shall inform the passengers to:

- A. Remain seated facing forward at all times while the train is in motion.
- B. Remain seated on the train until it returns to the station.
- C. Not to lean out or reach for anything along the right-of-way while the train is in motion.
- D. Keep hands and feet within the boundaries of the riding car at all times while the train is in motion.
- E. Not to yell or scream while riding on the train, except in an emergency.
- F. Do not lean over or turn around while taking pictures when the train is in motion.
- G. Anyone disobeying these rules may be asked to leave the facility.
